POPULATION

In 2017-2018, the number of students ages 3-21 who received special education services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) was 7.0 million, or **14 percent** of all public school students.



Serving families of students with disabilities and those suspected of having a disability

Those with IEPs under any category:

- ▶ Intellectual disability
- ▶ Hearing impairment
- ▶ Visual impairment
- ▶ Deaf-Blindness
- ▶ Speech or language impairment
- ▶ Emotional disturbance
- ▶ Orthopedic impairment
- ▶ Autism
- ▶ Traumatic brain injury
- ▶ Other health impairment
- ▶ Multiple Disabilities
- ▶ Specific Learning Disability - 34%
- ▶ Developmental Delay

Those who are under age 3 and receiving Early Intervention Services

Those who MAY be eligible for a Section 504 Plan or an IEP



Small but Mighty

From October 2017 through September 2018

- ▶ Parent Centers across the nation had 1.1 million+ contacts with parents, students with disabilities, and professionals.
- ▶ 392,900+ parents received individual assistance
- ▶ 356,400+ parents attended trainings
- ▶ 359,000+ informed and trained
- ▶ 65,700+ students with disabilities informed and trained
